Light Photographic Squadron Sixty-two was formed in 1948. Its purpose is to provide photographs of targets and other intelligence data. Its planes are "Crusader" jets, a modified version of the F-8E fighter aircraft. These planes fly at better than 1,000 miles per hour and at altitudes greater than 60,000 feet. New 70mm cameras are lighter and smaller than former models used for similar missions. Other equipment in each plane also collects weather information.
